Pre-Transfusion Testing – UI Portal

What is the UI Portal?

The UI Portal is a place to tell us about why an UnInterpretable (UI) antibody identification result has been entered, what work has been done during the investigation, and uploads scans of panel and screen sheets.

If two antibodies have been positively identified, it is not necessary to submit a UI, as there will be a maximum of two antibodies per sample.

Since there is no requirement to exclude anti-E in the presence of anti-c (or anti-C in the presence of anti-e) in routine pre-transfusion testing, options are provided for anti- $c\pm E$ and anti- $e\pm C$, and these are counted as a single specificity for the purposes of EQA and it is not necessary to enter the second antibody in the 'cannot be excluded' section which would result in a UI submission being required.

Accessing the UI Portal

To open up the UI Portal within the website, click the UI box as shown in figure 1. The order of antibodies has been changed so that UI will always be the final option. A pop up message will appear, (see figure 2) click OK to continue.

Instructions

The UI Instructions button in the top right (see purple section in figure 4) links directly to this document.

Upload Document

Clicking on Upload Document (see orange section of figure 4) opens a file selection browser allowing required documents to be selected. Documents can be removed if required by clicking the X next to the file name.

Completed screen and panel sheets (with reactions and annotations) are required to allow a decision to be made on whether UK NEQAS agree with the UI submission. Analyser printouts are not required if they do not add anything to the interpretation.

There is a limit on the number of files and the file size, maximum 6 files of up to 2Mb each. If it is difficult to keep the files below the size limit, try black and white scans (if still legible), or scanning one document at a time.

Comments

The freetext box is for entering the required description of what work has been done, and why the investigation could not be completed. See the green section of figure 4 for examples.

Requirements met

The three tick boxes are mandatory and if submit is clicked at the top of the webpage when the boxes are not ticked, an error message will be shown. They are reminders of what is required to allow the UI submission to be submitted. See the blue section of figure 4.
